Legl Six countries have **legislation** that bans investments in cluster munition producers: Belgium, Ireland, Italy*, Luxembourg, the Netherlands and Spain.

Stmt Seven countries have said in **public statements** (delivered at conferences or by letter) that they consider investment in cluster munition producers to be prohibited under the Convention on Cluster Munitions: France, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Hungary, Malta, Slovenia, and the United Kingdom.

*Art. 7 (1) of the Italian implementation law criminalizes financial assistance to acts that are prohibited by the No. 95 legislation. A draft bill was submitted to the Senate on 26 April 2010 to prohibit Italian financial institutions from providing any form of support to Italian and foreign companies involved in a range of activities including the production, use, sale, import, export, stockpiling, or transport of antipersonnel mines as well as cluster munitions and explosive submunitions thereof.

European Parliament resolutions in [2005](#), [2007](#), and [2008](#) called upon member states to disinvest from cluster munition producers. The most recent European Parliament resolution, passed in July [2011](#), called on European Union member states to accede to the Convention on Cluster Munitions.

The Cluster Munition Coalition's Stop Explosive Investments campaign calls on governments to pass comprehensive national legislation that includes a ban on investments in cluster munition producers and calls on banks and other financial institutions to immediately disinvest from cluster munition producers and implement comprehensive policies banning investments in producers of these weapons.
